COUNCILLORS SUPPORTING LOCAL GROUPS

Through Hillingdon Council's highly successful and popular Ward Budget scheme we have been able to support a number of local groups continue to provide support and opportunities to local residents.

Recently we provided funding for Hillingdon Musketeers, a fencing club made up of local members, including many children, who use the facilities at Brunel University.

WE PROMISED AND CONTINUE TO DELIVER



When we were elected in May 2014, we promised to seek funding for more road resurfacing and replacement of footpaths that were most in need of being repaired.

Because we are able to directly influence the Leader of the Council and with the continued sound financial management of Hillingdon's resources, additional funding has been made available during the last six months, allowing increased investment in Brunel.

Several roads have been resurfaced and a number of footpaths have been replaced. **Cllr Roy Chamdal** said, "It is very clear from the residents that have spoken to me, that the improved road surfaces are much appreciated."

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS FOR SCHOOLS

In a first for London, Conservative Hillingdon has invested £1.7 million in installing cameras outside local schools. This is to identify motorists who endanger the lives of children and adults by ignoring yellow lines, and 'KEEP CLEAR' signs.

An image of the vehicle number plate of offending vehicles is captured and the DVLA provide registered keeper details to enable a penalty charge notice to be issued.



CCTV INSTALLED TO REDUCE ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR



Following an increase in anti-social behavior we have been working with a number of pro-active local residents to bring CCTV cameras to the areas most impacted.

We have recently had CCTV cameras installed in St Helen Close, Cowley, and Haig Road, Hillingdon. These cameras are recording all of the time and can be used to identify those committing offences.

Cllr Brian Stead said "Whilst the majority of residents in Brunel are proud to live in our area and take great care of where they live, there are some who act inconsiderately. We hope that the introduction of these cameras will act as both a deterrent and tool to catch those offending."
