Hillingdon Street lights to be upgraded

Conservative run Hillingdon Council is investing nearly £6 million to renew the Boroughs 24,000 Street lights over the next two years. The initiative will see existing street lights across the Borough upgraded to new LED lighting.

The investment is part of the Conservative administration's commitment to ensuring that our streets are safe for motorists and pedestrians. The new LED technology will see improved visibility and lower energy costs, saving around £800k a year to Hillingdon tax payers.

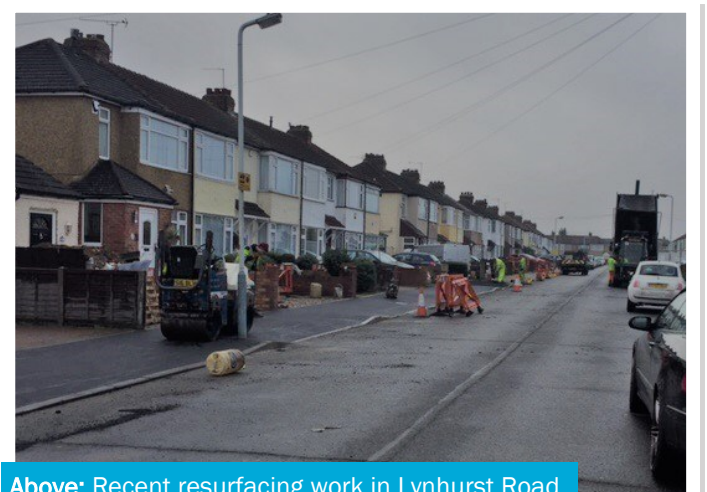

When we were elected in 2014, we promised to continue using our influence, as your Conservative councillors, to secure funding for the resurfacing of local roads and footpaths.

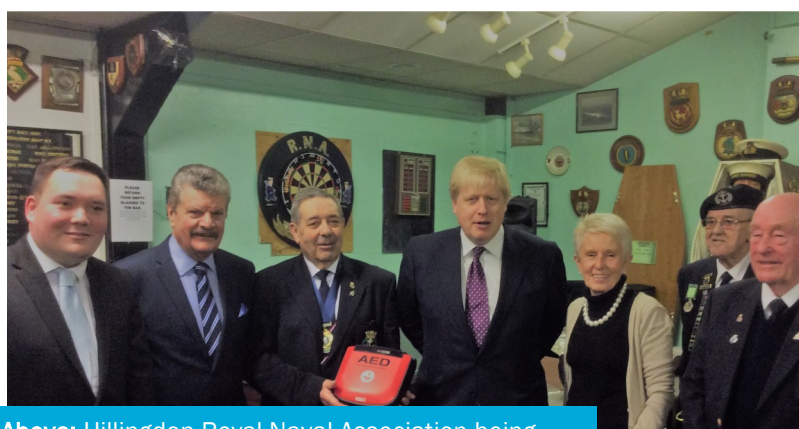
Because we are able to directly influence the Leader of the Council and with sound financial management of Hillingdon's resources, investment in Hillingdon East has continued.
