NEW RECREATION AREA AT COURT PARK

New Play equipment has recently been installed in Court Park following a suggestion by local residents which was supported by ward councillors.

The refurbished park, which includes a zip wire, was opened by the Mayor of Hillingdon in January, together with an outdoor gym for use by both adults and children.

The idea was funded from the council's popular Chrysalis Programme, a £1 Million fund which is spent on one off projects across the Borough from new playground equipment to resurfacing carparks. If you have an idea which may qualify for funding then please contact your local councillors.



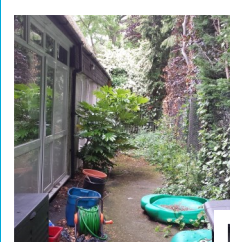
WARD BUDGET UPDATE

INVESTING IN OUR ROADS AND FOOTPATHS

When we were re-elected in May 2014, we promised to seek funding for more road resurfacing and replacement of footways that were most in need of being repaired.
