CLAMPING DOWN ON ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Following discussions and feedback from Cowley residents about mopeds and quad bikes being ridden dangerously through pedestrian areas, we have arranged installation of a barrier between Ivanhoe Close and St Helen Close.

Cllr Roy Chamdal said, "Since we have introduced this barrier, Cowley residents have seen a big reduction in terms of noise and incidents, which has been well received by those living locally, making them feel safer than before."

OPPOSING INAPPROPRIATE DEVELOPMENTS



A number of Brunel residents have successfully petitioned and objected to planning applications with our help as Local Councillors.

Cllr Richard Mills has spoken at a number of committee meetings in support of residents, which have led to planning applications being refused including applications for Houses of Multiple Occupation in Collingwood Road and Morello Avenue.

Cllr Mills said “The planning application process can be complicated; however I am pleased to support and speak up for residents in their objections, in order to prevent their local area becoming crowded and overdeveloped.”

ONGOING SUCCESS OF STREET SURGERIES

We are pleased to have continued our local street surgeries across the Ward, and will continue to work all year round and be present and visible across Brunel.

Recently well attended surgeries took place in Harlington Road where local residents from nearby roads came and discussed a range of issues from parking to planning as well as thanking us for recently resurfacing their road.

NEW BUS ROUTE TO RUISLIP & HEATHROW



Following our representations to TFL, they have agreed to consult on a proposed new bus route from Ruislip to Heathrow that will allow residents close to the Uxbridge Road to access. The route would ensure there would be better connections to the new Elizabeth Line (Crossrail) at Hayes and with the route travelling along Long Lane, quicker access to the Met line at Hillingdon and also the Central line at West Ruislip.

TFL in proposing this route have acknowledged our argument of the need to improve public transport connections that go north/south within the Borough.

GREEN FLAG AWARDED IN BRUNEL WARD

Hillingdon residents may well be familiar with ‘Green Flag’ awards that are given to parks and open spaces that meet a required high standard. Hillingdon has the most Green Flags of any local authority in the UK and we are pleased that Brunel Ward has received its first, with Coney Green being awarded this status.
