UXBRIDGE POLICE STATION UPDATE

You'll have read in our last newsletter in January, that despite much local opposition from residents and Hillingdon Conservatives, Labour's Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, took a decision to close Uxbridge Police Station in December 2017.

Conservative Hillingdon Council have offered to buy Uxbridge Police Station for £4.5m from the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime and to pay half of the running costs for the next 5 years to ensure that proper facilities are available for our Hillingdon Police Officers.
