LABOUR SET TO CLOSE UXBRIDGE POLICE STATION

■ Despite opposition from local residents and Hillingdon Conservatives, Labour's Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan has continued with his plans to close the front counter at Uxbridge Police Station and is planning to sell the building at a later date.

Rather than taking responsibility for their actions, the Labour Party, both locally and at City Hall have resorted to blaming anyone but themselves.

Conservative Hillingdon Council have offered to buy Uxbridge Police Station for £4.5 Million from the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime and to pay half the running costs for the next five years to ensure that proper facilities are available for Hillingdon Police Officers.
